

## FROM PASTOR BARTON PRIEBE

AROUND 400 YEARS AGO, the Pilgrims came across the Atlantic Ocean to settle in the newly discovered Americas. The voyage took incredible courage as the Pilgrims travelled thousands of kilometers over uncharted seas. In order to achieve their new life in a new world, they made great personal sacrifices in comfort and wealth. Despite the difficulties, they built an entire town and established a town council. Their once future vision had become a present reality. The story is told (perhaps fictitiously) that in the third year, the town council voted to build a road eight kilometers into the wilderness. In the fourth year, the entire council was almost impeached for this decision. It was considered to be a waste of money and effort. Content in their current achievements, the people lacked the vision to discover and explore the vast land and resources of North America.

The founders of Central Baptist Church had a vision to see a church established in the downtown core of Victoria. Through the grace of God and the sacrificial giving of people this vision became a reality in 1929. People gave of their time, talents, and financial resources. Central went further and helped to plant churches in Brentwood Bay (1930), Luxton (1933), Duncan (1938), Sooke (1976), Saanich (1977), and Golden (1991).



Our recent consultation celebrated this remarkable history. It also warned that we have become comfortable and have plateaued in almost every way. The report called us to step out in faith by creating a new vision that builds new roads of ministry into the future. This RENEW booklet outlines our proposed vision and the key objectives we believe need to happen in order to see the vision start to become a reality over the next five years.

This is an exciting time in the life of Central Baptist Church. As you read, we pray you will catch a vision for the next stage of what God has for us.



# RENEWING OUR COMMUNITY THROUGH THE GOSPEL

To renew something assumes that it was once good, has subsequently been ruined, but is in the process of being restored. This is the story of the Bible. Everything God made was good. Human sin brought ruin and devastation to every part of our existence. The gospel, or good news, is that God is working to renew and restore his fallen creation through Jesus Christ.

We believe that the gospel message is not merely a body of truth to be acknowledged but that it is the very power of God that transforms and renews everything it comes in contact with – personal lives, families, workplaces, and whole societies.





This renewal begins when a person receives the gospel and their once broken relationship with God is restored.

- OUR WORLD: Through global missions and strategic partnerships, we envision Central bringing gospel renewal to those places around the world where we have influence.

### **OBJECTIVES**

THE FOLLOWING FIVE OBJECTIVES outline what we believe we need to do in the next five years in order to see our vision of gospel renewal start to become a reality.



### We need a clear pathway for people to learn what the gospel is and how it works out in every area of life.

WHY? Since the gospel is the very centre of the RENEW vision, Central must have clear steps for people to learn the gospel and grow in it.

**How?** Clear pathways will be implemented including a core four-week track for newcomers, a fresh re-visioning of our community groups with the majority of our people participating, and age-specific curriculum.



### We need to become known for seeking the common good of the city.

**WHY?** The gospel compels us to "love our neighbour." A gospel centered church must be known for its acts of service, compassion, and justice as these help authenticate the message it preaches.

HOW? We will pursue and establish local and global partnerships that inform our activity and create renewal in our city and beyond. We will also ensure that living out the gospel is never separated from the declaration of the gospel.

Note: details for each of these five objectives are worked out in a five-year strategic plan document



### We need to utilize current technology to contextualize the gospel for our culture.

**WHY?** Our multi-media capabilities need to be brought up to date so we can reach present and future generations.

**HOW?** Central will strive for a significant social media presence on popular platforms, increase the quality of multimedia in our worship services, and modernize all our brochures and hand-out materials. Technology will be better integrated into church life and ministry.



### We need to grow our under 40 demographic while engaging and valuing our seniors.

**WHY?** To ensure a strong and healthy church exists ten years from now, Central needs to focus on getting younger and yet do so in a way that appreciates and involves its senior population.

**HOW?** We will create a vibrant and relevant Sunday morning service that attracts younger people, update Children's and Youth Ministries, and multiply family ministries. Alongside this, we will seek to mobilize our seniors in prayer, volunteering, and sharing their lives with those who are younger.



### We need to multiply gospel centred congregations.

**WHY?** It will take more than Central Baptist to bring gospel renewal across the CRD. The most effective way to light up the darkness is not to place all the lamp posts on one corner but, rather, to spread them out over the city.

**HOW?** We will partner with West Village Church (a Fellowship Baptist church in Langford) in their present efforts to plant a church in the Tillicum-Gorge area and will consider multiplying our own congregation by launching a second service.



**PRAY -** Spend regular time in prayer for gospel renewal in our church, our city, and those places in the world where Central has influence.

**ENGAGE -** This vision cannot be accomplished simply by Sunday attendance, but by all of us engaging ourselves in the gospel, in the Central community, and through serving in our own spheres of influence.

GIVE - Generosity is at the very heart of the gospel – "God so loved the world that he gave His only Son." Since God has been so radically generous with us, we delight to give in order to see his work done.
